Course Outline:

Chapter 1: Linear systems, row reduction and echelon form, linear independence, linear transformations.

Chapter 2: Matrix operations, the inverse of a matrix, matrix factorization, subspaces, dimension and rank.

Chapter 3: Determinant, Cramer's rule.

Chapter 4: Vector spaces and subspaces, null spaces, bases, dimension of a vector space, change of basis.

Chapter 5 (if time allows it): Eigenvectors and eigenvalues, the characteristic polynomial, diagonalization, eigenvectors and linear transformations.

Grading System: The final grade will be determined by a midterm, a final exam, four quizzes, and the homework. The weight of each component is as it follows:

Quizzes 10%

Midterm 30%

Final 40%
