Text: Calculus, one and several variables, Tenth edition, by Salas, Hille, Etgen.

Course Outline:

- Integration (Chapter 5): Antiderivative, basic rules of integration, the fundamental theorem of calculus, area between two graphs, indefinite integral, u-substitution.
- Some applications of the integral (Chapter 6): area, volume, work.
- The trascendental functions (Chapter 7): one-to-one functions, inverse functions, logarithms, exponentials, inverse trigonometric functions.
- Technique of integrations (Chapter 8): integration by parts, integration of trigonometric functions, trigonometric substitutions, partial fractions.
- Sequences, Indeterminate forms (Chapter 11): sequences, limit of sequences, indeterminate forms, improper integrals.
- Infinite series (Chapter 12): infinite series, divergence test, the comparison test, the limit comparison test, the root test, the ratio test, Taylor polynomial and Taylor series.

Grading System: The final grade will be determined by two midterms, the homework and the final. The weight of each component is as it follows:

Homework Grade 15%Midterm I 25%Midterm II 25%Final 35%

Exam Schedule: The first midterm will be on February 10, 2023, while the second midterm will be on March 16, 2022.

Lab: There is a lab associated with this class. Lab time will be used in multiple ways: to go over more examples, to answer homework questions, and

as a problem session. You will need a standard scientific calculator for the class.

Homework: You will have a homework assignment due every week. If you work all the assigned homework problems, you should do well in the course. Without practicing the material covered in class, it will be unlikely that you will learn the material and receive a good grade. The homework assignment will be due on Friday. No late assignment will be accepted. I will drop one homework assignment (the lowest) when computing your homework grade. If you cannot do an assignment, that is the assignment which will be dropped.

Class Policies: You should attend both the lecture and the lab if you want to do well in the class. Cell phones should be turned off during class. Midterms and exams must be taken on the date assigned. During the exam you will be able to utilize a calculator, but the use of books, calculators that can store formulas, cell phones, or other aids is prohibited.
