

Guide to Fast Pass

1. After arriving, pick up your registration package on the main floor of the Academic Building (OA), and then head over to OA 1033.

2. Next, choose 2 of the 5 following breakout sessions:

Attend your 1st choice, then head to your 2nd choice after the first finishes.

Money, Money, Money *(in OA 2014)*

At this workshop attendees will gain an understanding of awards and financial aid available throughout the year, and when to apply. With information on the timing of scholarships, bursary, and financial aid (Including OSAP) distribution, students will be able to calculate the amount(s) due to the University.

Wolfie's Top 10 *(in OA 2019)*

After attending this session attendees will be familiar with common strategies for succeeding while at Lakehead University.

Get to Know your Student Union *(in OA 2015)*

After attending this session students will understand the function and purpose of the Lakehead University Student Union (LUSU), the key services they provide, and the ways in which students can get involved.

Gateway *(in OA 2018)*

This session is mandatory for and exclusive to students who received an offer of admission specifying that they are part of the Gateway program (this will also be noted inside your registration package). You'll learn about the requirements and the support you receive as part of the Gateway program.

Life in Residence *(Residence Building)*

After attending this session attendees will be familiar with Lakehead Orillia's residence building and will know the benefits of living in residence!
