Pedagogical rationale for this proposal. Why are you submitting this request?:	<p>The proposed program seeks to address a growing demand by students to have the option to undertake an HBA in French and History. Both departments have seen an increase in inquiries for this option internally and, perhaps more importantly, during recruitment activities within schools and at larger events such as the Ontario Universities Fair. The Departments of Languages and History have long had a close association. For example, we have continued to work together to coordinate Classics courses, and History majors seeking to continue on to graduate school or public service careers have been encouraged and opted to take language courses, particularly French, as part of their degrees. Many students in the French program have taken courses from the Department of History to round out their degrees and gain a deeper understanding of the historical context of the societies whose languages they are mastering. The HBA (French and History) is mainly based on the existing combined degree options offered by the Department of Languages and the Department of History. Both departments see the necessity to further broaden their programs, as has been done in the past with existing combined majors in French and Philosophy, English and French, and, for the Department of History, a joint BA (History) and HBOR with the School of Outdoor Recreation. The combined HBA History program can also be taken with English, Philosophy, Political Science, and Women's Studies. In addition to subject areas, the proposed HBA</p>

(French and History) differs from existing combined degree options at the first year; to ensure that students have a good oral proficiency in French, 1FCE oral French is highly recommended. The option of completing a HBABED/IS in French and History will also be offered, as it is already the case for HBABED English/French. This option will better prepare students for the academic world where instructors are often teaching two or more subjects at the high school level. This degree will increase the chance for students to get a permanent job faster having been already trained in a multidisciplinary way. The requirements will follow the regulations of any concurrent HBABED/IS in the Faculty of Social Sciences & Humanities (see section 6.2) We are aware that it is crucial to offer students more possibilities to not only achieve a degree in a few years in a target language or a target topic, but also to improve their view of the world. The Faculty of Social Sciences and Humanities is at a turning point, as the university seeks to expand its international activities. A double major in French and History will provide students the opportunity to further their knowledge in the interconnected areas of language, culture, literature, and the history of la "Francophonie." Such an option would increase success at the graduate level in History (where second language proficiency is an asset), government and public service positions (where French is required at many levels), and producing students who can apply for professional programs such as law and also be able to meet the needs of the Franco-Ontarian community. Having a combined HBA in French and History with a Concurrent Education option would provide students with an opportunity to achieve an advanced level of competencies in French, while developing their skills in analyzing and doing research in the area of history, literature and culture. The teaching skills are developed in third and fourth year courses through oral presentation in class, interaction with other students about literary or culture topics, and during their professional year in the Faculty of Education. As well, the History program is developing students' skills in a wide variety of areas, centering chiefly on the development of their ability to read and communicate sophisticated historical materials, their ability to research and write reports and essays rooted in historical evidence, their ability to think independently and critically, and their ability to understand current affairs in an historical context. Students also develop the required teaching skills in part through dynamic interaction in History classes (particularly in fourth year honors seminars) and through Education courses. Why are you submitting this request?:	<p>The proposed program seeks to address a growing demand by students to have the option to undertake an HBA in French and History. Both departments have seen an increase in inquiries for this option internally and, perhaps more importantly, during recruitment activities within schools and at larger events such as the Ontario Universities Fair. The Departments of Languages and History have long had a close association. For example, we have continued to work together to coordinate Classics courses, and History majors seeking to continue on to graduate school or public service careers have been encouraged and opted to take language courses, particularly French, as part of their degrees. Many students in the French program have taken courses from the Department of History to round out their degrees and gain a deeper understanding of the historical context of the societies whose languages they are mastering. The HBA (French and History) is mainly based on the existing combined degree options offered by the Department of Languages and the Department of History. Both departments see the necessity to further broaden their programs, as has been done in the past with existing combined majors in French and Philosophy, English and French, and, for the Department of History, a joint BA (History) and HBA with the School of</p>

History, a joint BA (History) and BSc with the School of Outdoor Recreation. The combined HBA History program can also be taken with English, Philosophy, Political Science, and Women's Studies. In addition to subject areas, the proposed HBA (French and History) differs from existing combined degree options at the first year; to ensure that students have a good oral proficiency in French, 1FCE oral French is highly recommended. The option of completing a HBABED/IS in French and History will also be offered, as it is already the case for HBABED English/French. This option will better prepare students for the academic world where instructors are often teaching two or more subjects at the high school level. This degree will increase the chance for students to get a permanent job faster having been already trained in a multidisciplinary way. The requirements will follow the regulations of any concurrent HBABED/IS in the Faculty of Social Sciences & Humanities (see section 6.2). We are aware that it is crucial to offer students more possibilities to not only achieve a degree in a few years in a target language or a target topic, but also to improve their view of the world. The Faculty of Social Sciences and Humanities is at a turning point, as the university seeks to expand its international activities. A double major in French and History will provide students the opportunity to further their knowledge in the interconnected areas of language, culture, literature, and the history of la "Francophonie." Such an option would increase success at the graduate level in History (where second language proficiency is an asset), government and public service positions (where French is required at many levels), and producing students who can apply for professional programs such as law and also be able to meet the needs of the Franco-Ontarian community. Having a combined HBA in French and History with a Concurrent Education option would provide students with an opportunity to achieve an advanced level of competencies in French, while developing their skills in analyzing and doing research in the area of history, literature and culture. The teaching skills are developed in third and fourth year courses through oral presentation in class, interaction with other students about literary or culture topics, and during their professional year in the Faculty of Education. As well, the History program is developing students' skills in a wide variety of areas, centering chiefly on the development of their ability to read and communicate sophisticated historical materials, their ability to research and write reports and essays rooted in historical evidence, their ability to think independently and critically, and their ability to understand current affairs in an historical context. Students also develop the required teaching skills in part through dynamic interaction in History classes (particularly in fourth year honors seminars) and through Education courses. Why are you submitting this request?:	<p>After considerable conversation, debate and analysis of trends over time, the School of ORPT has decided that significant changes are required to the structure of our program. The proposed new HBOR degree structure reflects changes in industry and society, responses to student feedback and the reduction in faculty complement. We are aiming to provide excellence in programing within the limits of the resources available to us. The first year of our program only had two OUID courses and our students found that this did not give them a sense of belonging within in the program; we have reinstated a first year course and moved one of our second year courses to the first year. The second year of our program had too many OUID courses, and students felt overwhelmed. Further, three of our field-based courses fell within this year and the third and fourth years of our program did not have any required field-based courses. As a result we moved one course to first year and made our required field exploration course a full year third year course. Finally, both of our research methods classes fell in the third year, and we found that students were not prepared for various kinds of research projects early enough, as a result we moved one of these to the second year. We have also added required content by making our current elective course on risk management mandatory, reflecting the nature of the changes within industry. We have also added a fourth year, 1 FCE required "career explorations" course, which will give students the opportunity to gain work experience and prepare for the work environment. To address the reduction in our faculty complement, we have combined two of our second year courses (Theory of Parks and Theory of Tourism) into one course. These curriculum changes affect each of our partnering degrees (Geography, History, Natural Science, Women's Studies and Concurrent Education - IS, JI, PJ) all of whom have been consulted and are in favour of the changes.
