The most popular combination of disciplines within the HBASC degree is Criminology and Psychology. However, none of the new concentrations is designed for students studying this combination of disciplines. This could be rectified by incorporating Criminology within the Human Nature Concentration, which is the only concentration currently featuring Psychology courses. Hence it is proposed, in a separate calendar change, to add CRIM 3511 to the Human Nature Concentration course list as this course already addresses biological and psychological accounts of violence. The current proposed calendar change altering the title and course description for CRIM 3511 simply makes explicit what is already the case and, thereby, highlights the relevance of this course for the Human Nature Concentration.
