Why are you Agreement between Dawson College Community Recreation and submitting this request?: Leadership Training Diploma to Honours Bachelor in Outdoor Recreation Degree Through consultations with faculty and administrators at Georgian College, Dawson College and Canadore College it was identified that Community Recreation and Leadership Training diplomas, or in the case of Dawson College the Community Recreation and Leadership Training diploma, provided a strong skills centred base of knowledge that matched well with HBOR learning outcomes for the purposes of assessing transfer credit and providing an efficient Honours Bachelor credential pathway through the HBOR program. Often students at the aforementioned institutions complete their co-ops and internships in nature based settings and, according to college program coordinators and academic advisors, a significant portion show interest in continuing their education with an outdoor focus. As the Recreation and Leisure industry is increasingly recognizing the importance of experiences in natural settings as a positive influence on the social, physical and economic health of modern urban communities; professionals with the practical and vocational skills learned in college settings combined with the critically reflective, research oriented, and theoretical skill sets developed in university are increasingly in demand. Originally the intent was to develop a multi-lateral agreement across all Community Recreation and Leadership Training Diplomas offered at Ontario Colleges. Due to large discrepancies between program content and curriculum between all Ontario institutions focus was placed on institutions with closely matching curriculum and an established interest in developing transfer pathways with <u> Lakehead University including: ? Georgian College - Based on</u> MOU's signed between Lakehead University and Georgian College there is a strong push for developing transfer pathways to create efficiencies between our respective institutions. Our Learning Outcome Content Gap Analysis process identified that <u>Georgian College has a strong Recreation and Leisure curriculum</u> which matches well with the HBOR program ? Dawson College Dawson College (Quebec) has been advocating for an articulation agreement between their Community Recreation and Leadership Training diploma program and the HBOR consistently for the past two years. Their three year program has content which is very closely matched to the Ontario Community Recreation and Leadership Training programs assessed in this project. ? Canadore College - Upon becoming aware of the HBOR pathways grant at an ONCAT event, the Dean of the Media, Arts, Recreation and Access at Canadore college sought out the project team and submitted all course documentation to pursue pathways for appropriate programs at Canadore. Based on our work with Georgian and Dawson college, we were able to efficiently assess Canadore's curriculum and determine appropriate transfer credit. After a learning outcome based curriculum assessment and multiple rounds of consultations the result is a single block transfer pathway that has been designed for all three colleges. To be clear, the HBOR curriculum, transfer mapping and transfer credits are the same for all three aforementioned college programs. Based on the success of these upcoming articulation agreements, there is the potential that this pathway can serve as a template for further work into the development of a multi-lateral agreement (across all Ontario colleges) when the articulation agreements expire

in 2022. For the purposes of this project, each College will have a separate articulation agreement that is associated with its own individual Major Modification Proposal to demonstrate rigour in development. Dawson College Diploma graduates entering this pathway will complete the HBOR degree within three years (15 FCEs). The pathway is outlined by semester in Figure 1 and can be compared to the complete four year HBOR degree outlined in Table 1 (found in Section 4 - Structure). Pathway students cannot enrol in any of our double degrees as they would not be able to meet the degree requirements of the partner degree within the three year program. To complete a double degree, block transfer students in this pathway would need to enrol into one of the existing four year degree programs. OUTD 3380 will be split into two half courses, one third year Winter Term and one fourth year Fall term. This reflects the work that is being conducted by the students at the appropriate times. Canadore College - Upon becoming aware of the HBOR pathways grant at an ONCAT event, the Dean of the Media, Arts, Recreation and Access at Canadore college sought out the project team and submitted all course documentation to pursue pathways for appropriate programs at Canadore. Based on our work with Georgian and Dawson college, we were able to efficiently assess Canadore's curriculum and determine appropriate transfer credit. After a learning outcome based curriculum assessment and multiple rounds of consultations the result is a single block transfer pathway that has been designed for all three colleges. To be clear, the HBOR curriculum, transfer mapping and transfer credits are the same for all three aforementioned college programs. Based on the success of these upcoming articulation agreements, there is the potential that this pathway can serve as a template for further work into the development of a multi-lateral agreement (across all Ontario colleges) when the articulation agreements expire in 2022.
