First, we now define the major at the beginning of the calendar entry. We now define the major as the student's discipline and the INTD courses. Previously the major was not specified and the student's cumulative average was used as the major average. Second, we have moved some of the department regulations into the description of the degree itself in the notes. Notes 1-3 in particular are impacted by this shift of regulations from the departmental regulations to the degree requirements. These changes were made to make the regulations more transparent / accessible to students. In an effort to make things more transparent, we have indicated explicitly what disciplines they

~~may choose from for their degree (note 2). Beyond the changes to the notes, we are eliminating the use of the term "specialization" from our degrees and replacing it with the term "discipline" to make the wording consistent with the new Senate approved calendar definitions. This change does not alter the structure of the degree or its learning outcomes. Next, in accord with the Senate approved ICR we have added a note to the calendar entry (#3) informing students that they need to complete 0.5 FCE of a Type E course. This is part of the note flagging breadth requirements to students. One small change is that English has changed ENGL 2903 (listed as one of the methods classes in Note 4) to ENGL 2913. Pedagogical rationale for this proposal. Why are you submitting this request?:	<p>To add a BASc option for students who are unable to meet the 70% HBASC average requirement for graduation. Without this option students who have studied for four years but haven't obtained a high enough average will have to drop down to the 3-yr BASC. Furthermore, the inclusion of this option encourages students in the third year of the HBASC to continue their studies into the 4th year despite a lower than required average. In other words, a student with a 69% average who doesn't think they will be able to pull their marks up might drop out of the HBASC at the end of the third year and graduate with the BASC. However, if they have the BASC4 option, they might be more likely to stay in the HBASC for another year to see if they can pull their marks up and graduate with the BASC4 if they do not. All the relevant courses are already being offered for the HBASC so there will be no budgetary implications. The learning outcomes are the same as the HBASC as it contains all the same courses as the HBASC. At present there is a bit of an anomaly as the HBASC requires students to complete INTD 4301 Honours Project, but in conjunction with the introduction of our new concentrations 2015-soc-5321, we are introducing new 4th year Inquiry courses with the title "Capstone Research in..." (see 2015-soc-5323) thereby eliminating the word "honours" from these courses. Finally, because we have introduced some new Inquiry classes (INTD, see 2015-soc-5323, 2015-soc-5324) as part of our proposed concentrations and we are treating these as suitable alternatives to the existing INTD requirements, we have changed the wording of the relevant requirements to accommodate this and updates to the HBASc IS Major and BASc IS Major programs: 1) The list of eligible courses to satisfy the second year methodology course requirement has been updated. Psychology 2101 is being discontinued and replaced by Psychology 2110 and Psychology 2112 in the list of eligible methodology courses. Political Science 2555 is being removed from the list of eligible methodology courses. 2) Women's Studies has been added as a disciplinary area.
