Program Requirements:

One Year program

Graduates from any four-semester (2-year) General Arts and Science Diploma or Liberal Arts Diploma college program in Ontario, with a 70% cumulative average or higher, may be admitted to the Bachelor of Arts and Science (BASc) Interdisciplinary Studies Major College Pathways program. To receive the full 8 FCEs of block transfer, reducing the remaining requirements to 7 FCEs, students must have completed the following courses as part of their college program:

- at least two (2) one-semester courses of math, science, geography, or introductory psychology
- at least one (1) one-semester course in Inquiry methods or Senior Academic Research (see Lakehead University Admissions website for list of acceptable college courses;
- at least two (2) one-semester college courses of advanced academic content (see Lakehead University Admissions website for list of acceptable college courses)
- at least two (2) introductory one-semester college courses in one (1) of the following disciplines: Anthropology, Biology, English Literature, Geography, General Science, History, Political Science, Psychology, Sociology (see Lakehead University Admissions website for list of acceptable college courses)

Students lacking such courses will be required to take them at Lakehead University.

This program requires completion of five (5) FCEs in one discipline, the first FCE of which should have been completed as part of the college diploma. A faculty advisor should be consulted regarding course selection. Applicants who have taken more than the minimum advanced level or second year university courses as part of their college programs may be eligible to receive up to two FCEs of advanced standing toward requirements below.

Meeting the minimum requirement does not guarantee admission to either the University or a specific program. An overall average of 60% is required for graduation from the BASc (Interdisciplinary Studies Major) College Pathways Program.

NOTES:

Note 1:

All students will satisfactorily complete one-half (0.5) FCE Interdisciplinary Studies course at third-year level.

Note 2:

Students must complete four (4) full-course equivalents (FCEs) in a discipline: two (2) FCEs at the second-year level and two (2) FCEs at the third or fourth year level. Eligible disciplines are Anthropology, Biology, Criminology, English, General Science (as defined as a "Teachable" by the Faculty of Education), Geography, History, Media Studies,

Political Science, Psychology, and Sociology Sociology, and Women's Studies.

Note 3:

By the end of the BASc (Interdisciplinary Studies Major) College Pathways program, at least two (2) FCEs must be Type C (Engineering, Mathematical and Natural Sciences) or Type D (Health and Behavioural Sciences) courses; and at least onehalf (0.5) FCE must be Type E courses. The Indigenous Content Requirement is being met by the inclusion of one-half FCE chosen from the list of Type E courses taken as an elective in any year of the program.

Note 4:

As part of the program, all students must complete one of the following methodological courses: Anthropology 2517, Biology 2910, Criminology 2090, English 2913, Environmental Sustainability 2033, Geography 2251, Geography 2271, Mathematics 2310, Media Studies 2230, Philosophy 2413, Political Science 2555, Psychology 2101, Psychology 2110, Psychology 2112, Sociology 2911.

First Year (Spring/Summer)

- (a) One and one-half FCE in discipline at second year level chosen in consultation with an academic advisor
- (b) One half-course elective at second year level (Type C, D or E courses recommended) chosen in consultation with an academic advisor

First Year (Fall/Winter)

- (a) One-half FCE in third year Interdisciplinary Studies
- (b) One half-course in discipline at second year level
- (c) Two FCEs in discipline at third or fourth year level
- (d) Two FCE electives at second or third year level (Type C, D or E courses recommended)

Pedagogical rationale for this proposal. Why are you submitting this request?:

There These are several housekeeping changes being made to the degree, most of which are small or housekeeping measures. First, we have moved some of the department regulations into the description of the degree itself in the notes. Notes 1-3 in particular are impacted by this shift of regulations from the departmental regulations to the degree reguirements. These changes were made to make the regulations more transparent / accessible to students. In an effort to make things more transparent, we have indicated explicitly what disciplines they may choose from for their degree (note 2). Beyond the changes to the notes, we are eliminating the use of the term "specialization" from our degrees and replacing it with the term "discipline" to make the wording consistent with the new Senate approved calendar definitions. This change does not alter the structure of the degree or its learning outcomes. Next, in accord with the Senate approved ICR we have added a note to the calendar entry (#3) informing students that they need to complete 0.5 FCE of a Type E course. This is part of the note flagging breadth requirements to students. One small change is that English has changed ENGL 2903 (listed as one of the methods classes in Note 4) to ENGL 2913. We have changed the course listed here accordingly. Finally, because we have introduced some new Inquiry classes (INTD, see 2015-soc-5324) as part of our proposed concentrations and we are treating these as suitable alternatives to the existing INTD requirements, we have changed the wording of the relevant requirements to accommodate this and updates to the BASc IS Major College Transfer program:1) The list of eligible courses to satisfy the second year methodology course requirement has been updated. Psychology 2101 is being discontinued and replaced by Psychology 2110 and Psychology 2112 in the list of eligible methodology courses. Political Science 2555 is being removed from the list of eligible methodology courses.2) Women's Studies has been added as a disciplinary area.
