Program Requirements:

Two Year program

Graduates from any four-semester (2-year) General Arts and Science Diploma or Liberal Arts Diploma college program in Ontario, with a 70% cumulative average or higher, may be admitted to the Honours Bachelor of Arts and Science (HBASc) (Interdisciplinary Studies Major) College Pathways program. To receive the full 8 FCEs of block transfer, reducing the remaining requirements to 12 FCEs, students must have completed the following courses as part of their college program:

- at least two one-semester courses of math, science, geography, or introductory psychology;
- at least one one-semester course in Inquiry methods or Senior Academic Research (see Lakehead University Admissions website for list of acceptable college courses);
- at least two one-semester college courses of advanced academic content (see Lakehead University Admissions website for list of acceptable college courses);
- 4) at least two introductory one-semester college courses in two (2) of the following disciplines: Anthropology, Biology, English Literature, Geography, General Science, History, Political Science, Psychology, Sociology (see Lakehead University Admissions website for list of acceptable college courses).

Students lacking such courses will be required to take them at Lakehead University in addition to the courses listed below.

This program requires completion of five (5) FCEs in each of two disciplines, the first FCE of which should have been completed as part of the college diploma. A faculty advisor should be consulted regarding course selection. Applicants who have taken more than the minimum advanced level or second year university courses as part of their college programs may be eligible to receive up to two FCEs of advanced standing toward requirements below.

Meeting the minimum requirement does not guarantee admission to either the University or a specific program. An overall average of 70% is required for graduation from the HBASc (Interdisciplinary Studies) College Pathways Program.

NOTES:

Note 1:

All students will satisfactorily complete two Interdisciplinary Studies courses: one-half (0.5) full course equivalents (FCE) at third-year level and one (1) FCE at fourth-year level.

Note 2:

Students must complete four (4) full-course equivalents (FCEs) in one discipline and four (4) FCEs in a second discipline: two (2) FCEs each at the second-year level and two (2) FCEs each at the third or fourth year level. Eligible disciplines are Anthropology, Biology, Chemistry, Criminology, English.

Entrepreneurship (see Note 3), French, General Science (as defined as a "Teachable" by the Faculty of Education), Geography, History, Media, Film, and Communications, Political Science, Psychology, Sociology, and Women's Studies. A course may only count as toward one discipline.

Note 3

Courses used towards the Entrepreneurship disciplinary area must be selected from the following list: Business 1311, Business 1312, Business 2312, Business 2314, Business 2318, Business 2319, Business 3315, Business 3355, and one (1) FCE from Business 3333, Business 4336, Business 4355, and Business 4375.

Note 4.

By the end of the HBASc (Interdisciplinary Studies) College Pathways program, at least two (2) FCEs must be Type C (Engineering, Mathematical and Natural Sciences) or Type D (Health and Behavioural Sciences) courses; and at least one-half (0.5) FCE must be Type E courses. Interdisciplinary Studies (INTD) courses do not count towards these area requirements, unless they are being taken as an elective. The Indigenous Content Requirement is being met by the inclusion of one-half FCE chosen from the list of Type E courses taken as an elective in any year of the program.

As part of the program, all students must complete one of the following methodological courses: Anthropology Anthropology 2517, Biology Biology 2910, Criminology Business 2312

Managerial Accounting, Chemistry 2111 Analytical Chemistry I, Chemistry 2211 Organic Chemistry I, Criminology 2090, English English 2913, Environmental Environmental Sustainability 2033, French 2101 Advanced Oral French, Geography 2251, Geography Geography 2271, Mathematics Mathematics 2310, MediaMedia, Film, and Communications 2230, Philosophy Philosophy 2413, Psychology 2110, Psychology 2112, Sociology 2911.

Pedagogical rationale for These are housekeeping changes and updates to the HBASc IS this proposal. Why are you Major and BASc IS Major programs: 1) The list of eligible courses submitting this request?: to satisfy the second year methodology course requirement has been updated . Psychology 2101 is being discontinued and replaced by Psychology 2110 and Psychology 2112 in the list of eligible methodology courses. Political Science 2555 is being removed from the list of eligible methodology courses.2) Women's Studies has been added as a disciplinary areato include Business 2312, Chemistry 2111, Chemistry 2211, and French 2101.2) Chemistry, Entrepreneurship, and French have been added as disciplinary areas. These three disciplinary areas add welcome diversity to the range of disciplinary areas currently offered in the IS major programs. Chemistry programming has been significantly expanded on the Orillia campus because of the Lakehead/Georgian Applied Life Sciences program. Students now have the opportunity to satisfy the requirements of the IS Major, and this degree also offers a fall-back option for Applied Life Sciences students who do not continue in the Lakehead/Georgian program. Orillia students have expressed a longstanding interest in a Business disciplinary area within the IS Major. Working with the Business program in Orillia, the disciplinary area of Entrepreneurship has been developed that provides a focused selection of Business courses that can be applied to satisfy the IS major requirements - these Business courses are already offered in Orillia and do not require additional resources. Finally, French is a subject in high demand in Orillia. Interdisciplinary Studies has traditionally

paid for French courses as part of the Concurrent Education program, and the Department of Languages has committed to expanding French offerings available to Orillia students.
