Program Requirements:

Four Year program

An overall 70% average through each year is required in the Interdisciplinary Studies Major, any additional elective Interdisciplinary Studies courses taken, and any additional elective courses taken in the first and second disciplines. The Interdisciplinary Studies Major consists of 12 FCEs: two (2) FCEs of Interdisciplinary Studies courses, five (5) FCEs in the first discipline, and five (5) FCEs in the second discipline. An average of 70% in courses from the International Conflict and Human Rights concentration is also required.

Note 1:

In addition to Interdisciplinary Studies 1011, 3011, and either 4821 or 4901, students must complete five (5) full-course equivalents (FCEs) in one discipline and five (5) FCEs in a second discipline. The concentration consists of five (5) FCEs: the two (2) FCEs of INTD courses listed above and three (3) FCEs beyond first year (including one (1) FCE at third or fourth year) chosen from the Social Justice Concentration Course List, ensuring representation from at least two disciplines (normally the two disciplines noted above, although electives may also be included).

Note 2:

The Social Justice Concentration is recommended for students in the HBASc Interdisciplinary Studies Major who are taking disciplinary courses in Criminology, English, Media, Film, and Communications, Political Science, Sociology, or Women's Studies. Students should ensure they have the appropriate prerequisites for upper-year disciplinary courses.

Note 3:

Courses used towards the Entrepreneurship disciplinary area must be selected from the following list: Business 1311, Business 1312, Business 2312, Business 2314, Business 2318, Business 2319, Business 3315, Business 3355, and one (1) FCE from Business 3333, Business 4336, Business 4355, and Business 4375.

Note 4:

By the end of four years (20 FCEs), at least three FCEs must be Type A (Humanities) or Type B (Social Sciences) courses; at least three FCEs must be Type C (Engineering, Mathematical and Natural Sciences) or Type D (Health and Behavioural Sciences) courses; and at least one-half FCE must be Type E courses. Interdisciplinary Studies (INTD) courses do not count towards these area requirements, unless they are being taken as an elective. The Indigenous Content Requirement is being met by the inclusion of 0.5 FCE chosen from the list of Type E courses taken as an elective in any year of the program.

Note 45:

In Second Year, HBASc students must complete one of the following methodological courses: Anthropology 2517, Biology 2910, Business 2312 Managerial Accounting, Chemistry 2111 Analytical Chemistry I, Chemistry 2211 Organic Chemistry I, Criminology 2090, English 2903/2913, Environmental Sustainability 2033, Geography French 2101 Advanced Oral French, Geography 2251, Geography 2271, Mathematics 2310, Media, Film, and Communications 2230, Philosophy 2413, Psychology 2110, Psychology 2112, Sociology 2911.

First Year

- a) Interdisciplinary Studies 1011
- b) One FCE in first discipline (Criminology, English, Media, Film and Communications, Political Science, or Sociology)
- c) One FCE in second discipline (Anthropology, Biology, Chemistry, Criminology, English, Entrepreneurship, French, General Science, Geography, History, Media, Film, and Communications, Political Science, Psychology, Sociology, or Women's Studies)
- d) One and one-half FCEs of electives (Note the Type C, D, and E courses requirement.)
- e) One FCE elective at first-year level (chosen from Criminology, English, Media, Film, and Communications, Political Science, Sociology, or Women's Studies, unless the second discipline is one of these).

Second Year

- a) Two FCEs in first discipline at the second-year level (Note the methodological course requirement.)
- b) Two FCEs in second discipline at the second-year level
- c) One FCE elective (Note the Type C, D, and E courses requirement.)

Note: Two FCEs should be chosen from the Social Justice Concentration Course List from at least two disciplines.

Third Year

- a) Interdisciplinary Studies 3011
- b) One FCE in first discipline at the third- or fourth-year level
- c) One FCE in second discipline at the third- or fourth-year level
- d) Two and one-half FCEs electives (Note the Type C, D, and E courses requirement.)

Note: One FCE should be chosen from the Social Justice Concentration Course List at the third- or fourth-year level.

Fourth year

- a) Interdisciplinary Studies 4821 or 4901
- b) One FCE in first discipline at the third- or fourth-year level
- c) One FCE in second discipline at the third- or fourth-year level

d) Two FCE electives at second-year level or above.

Psychology 2101 is being discontinued and replaced by Psychology 2110 and Psychology 2112 in the list of eligible methodology courses. Political Science 2555 is being removed from the list of eligible

methodology courses.4) The list of eligible courses to be

applied to each concentration has been updated by removing courses that have been discontinued and adding courses that have been calendared by other departments in the three years since the concentration lists were originally approved to include Business 2312, Chemistry 2111, Chemistry 2211, and French 2101.2) Chemistry, Entrepreneurship, and French have been added as disciplinary areas. These three disciplinary areas add welcome diversity to the range of disciplinary areas currently offered in the IS major programs. Chemistry programming has been significantly expanded on the Orillia campus because of the Lakehead/Georgian Applied Life Sciences program. Students now have the opportunity to satisfy the requirements of the IS Major, and this degree also offers a fall-back option for Applied Life Sciences students who do not continue in the Lakehead/Georgian program. Orillia students have expressed a longstanding interest in a Business disciplinary area within the IS Major. Working with the Business program in Orillia, the disciplinary area of Entrepreneurship has been developed that provides a focused selection of Business courses that can be applied to satisfy the IS major requirements - these Business courses are already offered in Orillia and do not require additional resources. Finally, French is a subject in high demand in Orillia. Interdisciplinary Studies has traditionally paid for French courses as part of the Concurrent Education program, and the Department of Languages has committed to expanding French offerings available to Orillia students.
