Program Requirements:
Graduates of a 2-year diploma program in Police Foundations at

Sheridan College may be admitted to the Honours Bachelor of Arts and Science (Criminology Major). They are eligible to be credited with 10 FCEs, reducing the remaining requirements to 10 FCEs (with an overall average of 70% in any Criminology courses taken by a student).

To be considered for admission, applicants are required to have completed the Sheridan College Police Foundations diploma with an overall 70% minimum average.

Meeting the minimum requirement does not guarantee admission to either the University or a specific program.

In fulfillment of the requirements of the Honours Bachelor of Arts and Science (Criminology Major) transfer students must take those courses listed below.

First Year at Lakehead University

- (a) Criminology 2015 and Criminology 2090
- (b) One FCE in Criminology at the third year level
- (c) One-half FCE in Interdisciplinary Studies at the first year level or University Seminar 1016
- (d) One-half FCE from Political Science, Sociology, or Psychology
- (e) One-half FCE from Type A or B courses
- (f) One-half FCE from Type C or D courses
- (g) One-half FCE from Type E courses at the second year level or above
- (h) One-half FCE in Interdisciplinary Studies at the third year level

Second Year at Lakehead University

- (a) Criminology 4801 or Interdisciplinary Studies 4901 or 1 FCE Criminology at the fourth year level
- (b) Criminology 4035
- (c) One FCE in Criminology at the fourth year level
- (d) One-half FCE from Type A or B courses at the second year level or above
- (e) One-half FCE from Type C or D courses at the second year level or 2nd year or above
- (f) One and one-half FCE electives at the third or fourth year level

Pedagogical rationale for The purpose of this major modification is to augment the this proposal. Why are you original Criminology transfer pathway such that a special submitting this request?: pathway exists between Sheridan College's Police Foundation Diploma and Lakehead University's Criminology Degree. The current pathway gives 6 FCEs of transfer credit for a two year diploma from any Police Foundations program in Ontario. This arrangement is not competitive with other transfer pathways, which tend to provide the equivalent of 10 FCEs of credit for this transfer pathway (e.g., students transferring into Ontario Tech University with a two year Police Foundations diploma move directly into third year; Ontario Tech University is a direct competitor to Lakehead both in terms of location and school rankings). Remaining competitive with other universities in the region is critical to continuing to grow Lakehead's enrollments. Further, advancing the educational training of persons interested in a career in law enforcement is a key

social initiative in Canada now and for the foreseeable future. It is important that persons who go into the field of policing (as well as related careers, such as corrections, probation, border services, etc.) have been exposed to the intellectual vibrancy that university training offers. Enhancing the viability and ease of transitioning a college diploma into a university degree at Lakehead promotes this outcome. The pathway offers students who have completed a college diploma oriented towards applied training for a field in law enforcement to extend their knowledge base by exploring a broader range of topics oriented towards crime and justice in society. While a Police Foundations diploma actually offers students a fairly limited range of career options, coupling this diploma with a university degree in Criminology greatly expands their career options to include: policing, probation, corrections, provincial government employment (e.g., Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario), federal government employment (e.g., Department of Justice), and entrance into professional school (e.g., law school) among other opportunities.
