Pedagogical rationale for INDI-3501 (Indigenous Story Pedagogy) is being made into a 2nd year course and changed from 1.0 FCE to a half credit/0.5 FCE. ----First, students currently entering INDI 3501 do not have the disciplinary background and the first half of the course is spent teaching introductory materials that should have been introduced in a second year course. Thus, the shift of INDI 3501 to a second year course is done in order to provide the students with the necessary scaffolding to undertake a more senior level course (4th year) in this area. ----Second, Indigenous Learning also has a significant number of required FCEs (3.5/3yr BA & 4.5 4/yr HBA) and this is part of a broader curriculum revision that seeks to reduce the number of required FCEs for students and develop more scaffolding and preparatory work at the lower level so that students are better prepared to take on capstone projects in their fourth year classes.
