Pedagogical rationale for this proposal. Why are you submitting this request?: ~~Rationale: To bring the BA (General) Pathways Program up to date.~~ Graduates of a 3-year diploma from any college in Ontario with a minimum average of 70%, may be considered for admission into the Bachelor of Arts (General Program).

Qualified applicants will receive a block transfer of 8.0 non-transferable FCEs toward the 15 FCEs required for the program. These non-transferable credits will include 5.0 FCEs at year 1 level (of which at least 4.0 FCE will be Humanities, Type A, or Social Science, Type B course credits) and 3.0 FCE at year 2 level (of which at least 2.0 FCE will be Humanities, Type A, or Social Science, Type B course credits). Meeting the minimum requirements does not guarantee admission to either the University or a specific program. Students can be admitted to either the Thunder Bay or the Orillia campus. The Bachelor of Arts (General Program) attempts to overcome the restrictions of traditional programs by allowing the student as much latitude as possible in choosing options. Students may pursue this program as either a full- or part-time student. The intent is to give some flexibility to the student on the seven (7) full course equivalents (FCE) required to complete the BA (General Program) degree with only the following exceptions: 1) A maximum of two (2) additional first or zero year level FCEs may be taken; 2) Two (2) FCEs of Type A or Type B [linked] (or a combination of both) must be taken at the third year level or above; 3) At least one-half (0.5) FCE of Type E courses must be taken to meet the Indigenous Content Requirement; 6) A minimum average of 60% is required in the Type A and Type B courses [linked] taken from the Faculty of Social Sciences and Humanities [here we do need to specify the Faculty, because this is where the Major Average for graduation will be calculated so they need an average of 60% in courses from us].
