Often faculty are required to teach reading courses as overload in order to assist students with completing the specializations.

Why are you teaching overload and supervision required by faculty, to offer students more options to obtain an HBA, to increase submitting this request?: the numbers of students graduating with an honours degree in Indigenous Learning, and to bring our program more in line with other programs at the university that already have introduced a course based four year honours degree. The introduction of a course-based option will also improve the accessibility of our program to students who come from different educational backgrounds and face a broad range ofsocial and economic challenges. --- The addition of a coursebased option and a community service-learning option that are part of the load, will reduce overload teaching and supervision for faculty. ---Other transitions are not applicable. We have the full-time faculty members to make the move to include a course based program already, so there are no budgetary implications. Courses will be rotated to ensure that students have access to the credits they need tomeet degree requirements. Change increases the number of Indigenous Learning course options available to fulfill requirements for the degree. ---All courses align with the Department's current learning objectives, so no changes to learning objectives are required at this time. In the fall of 2022, we replaced a required course: INDI 3501 (1.0FCE) with INDI 2012 (0.5FCE).Rational for this change: • Students currently entering INDI 3501 do not have the disciplinary background and the first half of the course is spent teaching introductory materials that should have been introduced in a second year course. Thus, the shift of INDI 3501 to a second year course is done in order to provide the students with the necessary scaffolding to undertake a more senior level course (4th year) in this area. • Indigenous Learning also has a significant number of required FCEs (3.5/3yr BA & 4.5 4/yr HBA) and this is part of a broader curriculum revision that seeks to reduce the number of required FCEs for students and develop more scaffolding and preparatory work at the lower level so that students are better prepared to take on capstone projects in their fourth year classes. Unfortunately, we did not make the program specific changes in the calendar at the same time. Thus, this navigator change is to fix these problems. As a result of the changes we needed to fix the number of FCEs taken at the third year level and shift a required course from the third to the second year level.
