Pedagogical rationale for There are two changes to this degree. The first is the addition of Interdisciplinary Studies has already applied to incorporate Philosophy as a discipline that students might choose to study. The second is revisions to the list of core disciplinary courses. In the last revision of the degree, starting Sept. 2022, students are required to complete a "core disciplinary course" within at least one of their disciplines. The list of eligible courses was incomplete as it did not include at least one course for each discipline. The new list includes at least one course for each discipline. Additionally, courses on this list were previously restricted to 2nd year "methodological" courses. This restriction was dropped starting 2022-23 and as a consequence contributing departments were invited to revise the course(s) they contribute to this list. Several departments recommended different or additional courses, which appear on the revised listwithin its degrees, starting in Sept. 2023. Given that several Philosophy courses are relevant to the Human Nature concentration, we propose to add several of these courses to the Human Nature Concentration Course List (the list of courses that comprise the concentration, in addition to INTD 1012, 3012, and 4822/4901). Given the number of relevant courses, we also propose to add Philosophy as a recommended discipline for the concentration.

The additions to the core disciplinary course list are all courses that are already routinely offered to support other programs on the Orillia campus or, in the case of the PHIL and WOME courses, are offered to support existing programs in Thunder Bay, but will be made available to Orillia students by being scheduled onlinePhilosophy courses being added to the concentration course list will be offered as part of the regular programming for the Philosophy discipline within the IS degrees. These courses do not need to be offered every year. Pedagogical rationale for In the last revision of the degree, starting Sept. 2022, this proposal. Why are you students are required to complete a "core disciplinary course" within at least one of their disciplines. The list of eligible courses was incomplete as it did not include at least one course for each discipline. The new list includes at least one course for each discipline [This is most relevant for the HBASC IS]. Additionally, courses on this list were previously restricted to 2nd year "methodological" courses. This restriction was dropped starting 2022-23 and as a consequence contributing departments were invited to revise the course(s) they contribute to this list. Several departments recommended different or additional courses,

which appear on the revised listInterdisciplinary Studies has already applied to incorporate Philosophy as a discipline within its degrees, starting in Sept. 2023. Given that several Philosophy courses are relevant to the Human Nature concentration, we propose to add several of these courses to the Human Nature Concentration Course List (the list of courses that comprise the concentration, in addition to INTD 1012, 3012, and 4822/4901).
