## Six Year program

An overall 70\% average through each year is required in the Interdisciplinary Studies Major, any additional elective Interdisciplinary Studies courses taken, and any additional elective courses taken in the first and second disciplines. The Interdisciplinary Studies Major consists of 13 FCEs: three (3) FCEs of Interdisciplinary Studies courses, five (5) FCEs in the first discipline, and five (5) FCEs in the second discipline. An average of $70 \%$ in courses from the International Conflict and Human Rights concentration is also required. In Concurrent Education programs at the Primary/Junior level, students must meet and complete requirements of the partnering Honours degree program including all Pre-Professional Program Education requirements (see Degree Programs information for Education requirements).

Note 1:
In addition to Interdisciplinary Studies 1014, 3014, and either 4824 or 4901 , students must complete Interdisciplinary Studies 2010, Interdisciplinary Studies 2030, five (5) FCEs in one discipline and five (5) FCEs in a second discipline. The Interdisciplinary Studies Major consists of 12-13 FCEs: two-three (z3) FCEs of Interdisciplinary Studies courses, five (5) FCEs in the first discipline, and five (5) FCEs in the second discipline. -An average of 60\%-70\% in courses from the International Conflict and Human Rights concentration is also required. In Concurrent Education programs at the Primary/Junior level, students must meet and complete requirements of the partnering Honours degree program including all Pre-Professional Program Education requirements (see Degree Programs information for Education requirements).

In Concurrent Education programs at the Primary/Junior level, students must meet and complete requirements of the partnering Honours degree program including all PreProfessional Program Education requirements (see Concurrent Degree Programs Information for Education requirements). A student registered in a Concurrent Education program must maintain a minimum cumulative average of $65 \%$.

In-With the last revision of introduction of 1 FCE of required INTD courses in previous changes to the degree, starting Sept. 2022, students are required to complete a "core disciplinary course" within at least one of their disciplines. The list of eligible courses was incomplete as it did not include at least one course for each discipline. The new list includes at least one course for each discipline. Additionally, courses on this list were previously restricted to 2nd year "methodological" courses. This restriction was dropped starting 2022-23 and as a consequence contributing departments were invited to revise the course(s) they contribute to this list. Several departments recommended different or additional courses, which appear on the revised listit may be difficult for students to take two FCEs of courses from the concentration list in their second year. As a result, the recommendation has been changed to 1 FCE of such courses at the second year, with a note added after the fourth year to take 1 FCE of course list courses.Additionally, the HBASC and BASC4 degrees were combined into one calendar entry in the last calendar, but the description of the BASC4 did not reflect changes that were made the HBASC. The BASC4 should be identical to the HBASC except for the lower GPA requirement. Consequently, the BASC4 requirements were corrected.
