Title of New Course: Ukraine since 1648

Course Description: Key developments in modern Ukrainian history from 1648 to the present are explored. Of particular interest will be a critical examination of Ukraine's complex relationship to the Russian Empire, the Soviet Union, and the post-Soviet Russian state. Ukraine's relationship with Poland, the Ottoman Empire, the Austrian (and Austro-Hungarian) Empire, and the West more generally will also be examined. Making use of primary sources, the rise of nationalism, the negotiation of national identity and historical memory, and Russia's invasion of Ukraine in February 2022 will also be examined.
