intervals, one-sample tests of hypothesis, an introduction to regression and correlationThis course introduces students to the principles and techniques of descriptive and inferential statistics as they apply to business decisionmaking. Emphasis is placed on data analysis, probability concepts, sampling, estimation, hypothesis testing, correlation, and regression analysis. Emphasis is placed on interpreting statistical results and applying statistical reasoning to solve practical business problems.
