What is the pedagogical Therapeutic Recreation (TR) is a growing professional field rationale for this of practice. Based on societal shifts there is an increased request? Why are you awareness of the connection between health and wellbeing and experiences in nature-based settings. Considering the abundance of outdoor recreation activities and access to natural setting in the Thunder Bay region, it is beneficial for TR professionals to gain skills in accessing and facilitating experiences in natural settings with the ability to negotiate risk and legal liability while demonstrating critical thought and professional excellence. Therapeutic Recreation Ontario (TRO) and the North American regulatory body (National Council for Therapeutic Recreation Certification) for Therapeutic Recreation professionals are currently in the process of professionalizing this line of work. These agencies require the completion of a four year

recreation degree with therapeutic recreation courses (Table 1) that are informed by professional Standards of Practice to become a fully qualified Therapeutic Recreation professional. Currently the only available degree offerings for TR diploma graduates are in Southern Ontario (Brock University and University of Waterloo). The proposed concentration has been developed in conjunction with TRO and the Recreation Therapy program at Confederation College to work towards ensuring that students in North Western Ontario will have the necessary university level courses and placement experiences to work towards becoming registered Therapeutic Recreationists in the province of Ontario. The proposed new course is one of the required elements of this concentration. Prerequisite update For example, is this change required for accreditation?

Will additional resources Yes. To offer the proposed Nature-Based Therapeutic Recreation Concentration, we will need an additional 0.5 FCE sessional support. This is due to the new course being proposed in this request (OUTD 4911). Given the increased enrollments that are projected (at a minimum 5 students per year), the costs of this sessional should be covered. There are two Confederation College Articulation Agreements that have been submitted to Senate, one of which (Confederation College Therapeutic Recreation Diploma to Honours Bachelor of Outdoor Recreation with Concentration in Nature-Based Therapeutic Recreation) is directly related to this proposal. There will be an additional 4 articulation

agreements coming forward (two with Georgian College, one with Sault College and one with Dawson College), all of which will contribute to increasing enrollment and thus justify the addition of 0.5 FCEs to support the Concentration.no
