sources, this course explores selected themes and events in the global history of revolt and revolution since the mid nineteenth century, when ideologies and political movements like Marxism, anarchism and fascism emerged and began giving shape to revolutionary movements around the world. The

course focuses primarily on different forms and

conceptualizations of rebellion during the twentieth century and concludes with an assessment of contemporary radical

movements on both the left and the right.
