An overall 70% average through each year is required in the Interdisciplinary Studies Major, any additional elective Interdisciplinary Studies courses taken, and any additional elective courses taken in the first and second disciplines. The Interdisciplinary Studies Major consists of 13 FCEs: three (3) FCEs of Interdisciplinary Studies courses, five (5) FCEs in the first discipline, and five (5) FCEs in the second discipline. An average of 70% in courses from the International Conflict and Human Rights concentration is also required.

In Concurrent Education programs at the Intermediate/Senior level, students must meet and complete requirements of the partnering Honours degree program including all Pre-Professional Program Education requirements (see Degree Programs Information for Education requirements). A student registered in a Concurrent Education program must maintain a minimum cumulative average of 65%.

Students must choose two teaching subjects or teachables, the first of which is also the first discipline within Interdisciplinary Studies. It is the student's responsibility to ensure that the second teachable is met through either the second discipline or electives. Eligible teachable subjects at Orillia include English, Environmental Science, Geography, History, Mathematics, Science-General, Science-Biology, Science-Chemistry, Social Sciences-General. See Department of Undergraduate Studies in Education, Levels and Teachables.

Note 1:

In addition to Interdisciplinary Studies 1014, 3014, and either 4824 or 4901, students must complete Interdisciplinary Studies 2030, Interdisciplinary Studies 2030, five (5) full-course equivalents (FCEs) in one discipline and five (5) FCEs in a second discipline. The concentration consists of five (5) FCEs: the two (2) FCEs of Interdisciplinary Studies 1014, 3014, and either 4824 or 4901 and three (3) FCEs beyond first year (including one (1) FCE at third or fourth year) chosen from the International Conflict & Human Rights Concentration Course List, ensuring representation from at least two disciplines (normally the two disciplines noted above, although electives may also be included).

Note 2:

The International Conflict & Human Rights Concentration is recommended for students in the HBAScBEd I/S Interdisciplinary Studies Major who are taking disciplinary courses in Criminology, English, History, Political Science, and Sociology. Students should ensure they have the appropriate prerequisites for upper-year disciplinary courses.

The first discipline must be one of the following teachable subjects: Biology, Chemistry, English, General Science (as defined as a Teachable by the Faculty of Education), Geography, or History. The second discipline must be one of the following Concentration disciplines: Criminology, English, History, Political Science, and Sociology. A course may only count toward one discipline.

If the second discipline does not directly align with a teachable, the teachable must be met via electives.

Why are you submitting this request?:	With the introduction of 1 FCE of required INTD courses in previous changes to the degree, it may be difficult for students to take two FCEs of courses from the concentration list in their second year. As a result, the recommendation has been changed to 1 FCE of such courses at the second year, with a note added after the fourth year to take 1 FCE of course list courses. Additionally, the HBASC and BASC4 degrees were combined into one calendar entry in the last calendar, but the description of the BASC4 did not reflect changes that were made the HBASC. The BASC4 should be identical to the HBASC except for the lower GPA requirement. Consequently, the BASC4 requirements were corrected.
