and Knowledges examines global systems of power, inequality,

and resistance through feminist, decolonial, and

intersectional lenses. Students explore how gendered and racialized structures shape global health governance, conflict, migration, and technological change. Readings and discussions draw on transnational, Black, and Indigenous feminist epistemologies, emphasizing lived experience, activism, and alternative ways of knowing. Each year, the course centres on a distinct theme—such as global health and

migration, refugees and borders, or technology and

governance—allowing students to apply feminist analysis to urgent global challenges and to imagine transformative

futures grounded in justice and care.
