We have revised all our programs and our curriculum to reflect current teaching expertise, trends in the discipline, and our reduced resources. Primary changes affecting the HBA program are: 1) a revised lineup of first-year courses, providing majors with more options; 2) a required pair of survey courses at second year, History of English Literature I and II, that are intended to provide our HBA students with a stronger background in the history of English Literature, as well as a cohort-forming experience; 3) a redistribution of year-level requirements (increased 2nd year and 4th year requirements and reduce 3rd year), which, accompanied by more rigorous prerequisites for third-year courses will result in a clearer differentiation of year levels; and 4) a division of our existing historical area requirement (pre-1800) into two halves (Medieval and Early Modern; 18th and 19th centuries) to further strengthen their knowledge of the history of English literature. We are also requesting to offer the HBA English and HBABEd majors, currently only offered in Thunder Bay, at the Orillia campus, as a complement to the HBASc English and HBAScBEd English majors
