Rationale Implementation of the 2 Year BEd program requirements for current program.	Rationale Implementation of the 2 Year BEd program requirements for current program. There are several changes being made to the degree, most of which are small or housekeeping measures. First, we now define the major at the beginning of the calendar entry. We define the major as the student's discipline and the INTD courses. Previously the major was not specified and the student's cumulative average was used as the major average. Second, we have moved some of the department regulations into the description of the degree itself in the notes. Notes 1-3 in particular are impacted by this shift of regulations from the departmental regulations to the degree requirements. These changes were made to make the regulations more transparent / accessible to students. In an effort to make things more transparent, we have indicated explicitly what disciplines they may choose from for their degree (note 2). Beyond the changes to the notes, we are eliminating the use of the term "specialization" from our degrees and replacing it with the term "discipline" to make the wording consistent with the new Senate approved calendar definitions. This change does not alter the structure of the degree or its learning outcomes. Next, in accord with the Senate approved ICR we have added a note to the calendar entry (#3) informing students that they need to complete 0.5	

FCE of a Type E course. This is part of the note flagging breadth requirements to students. One small change is that English has changed ENGL 2903 (listed as one of the methods classes in Note 4) to ENGL 2913. We have changed the course listed here accordingly. Finally, because we have introduced some new Inquiry classes (INTD, see 2015-soc-5322, 2015-soc-5324) as part of our proposed concentrations and we are treating these as suitable alternatives to the existing INTD requirements, we have changed the wording of the relevant requirements to accommodate this.

# Prior to Entry into the 2-Year Professional Program

In concurrent Education programs at the Primary/Junior level, students must meet and complete requirements of the partnering bachelor degree program including all Pre-Professional Program Education requirements prior to entry into the Professional Program. (See Concurrent Bachelor Degree Programs Information for Education requirements)

#### Note 1:

By the end of three years (15 FCEs) prior to Professional Program, at least three (3) FCEs must be from Type A or B courses and at least three (3) FCEs must be from Type C or D courses. See Interdisciplinary Studies Regulation #4.

#### Note 2:

In Second Year, BAScBEd students must complete one of the following methodological courses:
Anthropology 2517, Biology 2910, Criminology 2090, English 2903, Environmental Sustainability 2033, Geography 2251, Geography 2271, Mathematics 2310, Media Studies 2230, Philosophy 2413, Political Science 2555, Psychology 2101, Sociology 2911.

#### Note 3:

Concurrent Education P/J students must take an eligible Science (General Science 1000 recommended) as part of the Type C or D area requirement. See Concurrent Bachelor of Education Concurrent Content Regulation #1.

#### Note 4:

As part of the Type A or B area requirement, Concurrent Education P/J students must take one FCE of English, French, or Indigenous Language, and one half-course in Music or Visual Arts. See Concurrent Bachelor of Education, Concurrent Content Regulation #2.

### Requirements

Five Year program

Prior to Entry into the 2 Year Professional ProgramIn concurrent. An overall 65% average in the Interdisciplinary Studies Major through each year is required. The Interdisciplinary Studies Major consists of 6 FCEs: one (1) FCE of Interdisciplinary Studies courses and five (5) FCE in discipline. In Concurrent Education programs at the Primary/Junior level, students must meet and complete requirements of the partnering bachelor-Bachelors degree program including-program including all Pre-Professional Program Education requirements prior to entry into the Professional Program. (See Concurrent Bachelor-(see Degree Programs Information for Education requirements).

#### Note 1:

All students will satisfactorily complete two Interdisciplinary Studies courses: one-half (0.5) full course equivalents (FCE) at first-year level and one-half (0.5) FCE at third-year level.

#### Note 2:

Students must complete five (5) full-course equivalents (FCEs) in a discipline: one (1) FCE at the first-year level, two (2) FCEs at the second-year level, and two (2) FCEs at the third or fourth year level. Eligible disciplines are Anthropology, Biology, Criminology, English, Environmental Studies, General Science (as defined as a "Teachable" by the Faculty of Education)</a>, Geography, History, Media Studies, Political Science, Psychology, Sociology, or permission of the chair.

- (e) One half-course Education elective (see Electives in the Department of Undergraduate Studies in Education Courses list)

#### Note 3:

By the end of three years (15 FCEs) prior to rofessional Program, at least three (3) FCEs must be from Type A (Humanities) or Type B (Social Sciences) courses and; at least three (3) FCEs must be from Type C (Engineering, Mathematical and Natural Sciences) or Type D (Health and Behavioural Sciences) courses. See Interdisciplinary Studies Regulation #4.Note 2; and at least one-half (0.5) FCE must be Type E courses. The Indigenous Content Requirement is being met by the inclusion of one-half FCE chosen from the list of Type E courses taken as an elective in any year of the program.

#### Note 4:

In Second Year, BAScBEd-BASc students must complete one of the following methodological courses: Anthropology 2517, Biology 2910, Criminology 2090, English </a>-29032913, Environmental Sustainability 2033, Geography 2251, Geography 2271, Mathematics 2310, Media Studies 2230, Philosophy 2413, Political Science 2555, Psychology 2101, Sociology 2911.

### Note **35**:

Concurrent Education PPrimary/J-Junior students must take an eligible Science course (General Science 1000 recommended) as part of the their Type C or and D area requirement requirements. See Concurrent Bachelor Department of Undergraduate Studies in Education Concurrent Content Regulation #1.

Note 4:As part of the Type A or B area requirement, Concurrent Education P/J students must take one FCE of English, French, or Indigenous Language, and one half-course in Music or Visual Arts. See Concurrent Bachelor of Education, Concurrent Content Regulation #2.First Year:
