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Academic Record

- Law admissions is looking for evidence of ability to be successful in rigorous program Generally, we recommend a 75–80% average in last
- two years of undergrad
- Importance of academic performance versus program choice
- Opportunity for students to address anomalies in academic performance





LSAT Score

- Law School Admission Test is mandatory
- Generally, a score of 155 is solid and does not raise cause for concern
- A higher GPA can offset a lower LSAT and vice versa



Personal Statement

When advising students, emphasize the following:

- Highlight connection to Northern Ontario region
- Proofread, proofread, proofread!
- Avoid use of Artificial Intelligence
- Don't overshare





Autobiographical Sketch This section gives a fuller picture of the applicant's involvement outside of academics (volunteer, extracurricular, awards, employment, research)

Important for advisors to note:

- This section will not make or break an applicant but can provide extra context and bolster a middling application
- Law is looking for applicants involved in their community, that show leadership and initiative



Reference Letters

 Law admissions prefers two academic references – encourage students to build relationships with professors early in program to secure a robust academic reference

Letter of reference:

- Should be written on University letterhead and signed by referee
- Outlines professional relationship between instructor and student
- Speaks to as many of the capacities listed in checkbox section as possible
- Only speak to what you genuinely know about student
