About this Job

Reporting to the Equipment Depot Manager and Assistant Director of Outdoor Recreation, Parks & Tourism, the Outdoor Recreation Outreach Program Development Officer is actively involved in developing programming for community groups ranging from half-day, full-day, and multi-day programs at introductory through to advanced skill level offerings related to outdoor recreation, parks, tourism and leadership. The successful candidate will produce two seasonal catalogues of program offerings, pilot and evaluate a suite of programs, and prepare a plan to sustainably run the programming once the internship is complete.

Job Duties

- Administer outdoor equipment rentals and programming in Thunder Bay with particular attention to key community groups
- Develop a catalogue of half-day, full-day, and multi-day outdoor recreation programs that can be run as fee-for-service offerings through Lakehead University's Community Zone, direct contracts from community organizations (e.g. Scouts, Cadets), and partnerships with other Lakehead University units (e.g. Residence Life, Athletics, International Studies)



- Liaise with community organizations that seek programming to ensure our catalogue of offerings meets their needs and budget
- Identify staffing, budgets and pricing associated with each program offering
- Develop a database of qualified instructors who could deliver programming on a contract-basis
- Develop a risk management strategy for each program offering
- Evaluate cost/benefit for equipment rentals based on anticipated wear and tear, maintenance, and replacement costs
- Produce a catalogue of 3rd party training services and certifications sought by outdoor industry employers that could be incorporated into the suite of program offerings (e.g. Wilderness First Aid, Ice Safety, Whitewater Rescue)
- Prepare content for social media and other online promotion of equipment rentals and programming
- Liaise with Lakehead University faculty to identify opportunities for student involvement in program offerings as a form of community service learning (e.g. practicum for students in Experiential Education or Advanced Outdoor Leadership)
- Coordinate, evaluate and report on results of pilot program offerings

Qualifications

- Excellent written and oral communication skills
- Experience developing and delivering youth recreation programming
- Experience planning recreation and educational programs
- Familiarity with natural areas and indoor facilities in the Thunder Bay Area
- Familiarity with community organizations in the Thunder Bay Area
- Knowledge and experience with risk management associated with outdoor and educational programming
- Knowledge of budgeting
- Strong time management skills and ability to work towards goals independently
- G Driver's Licence
- Standard First Aid or higher

Certifications and experience at the Instructor level for one or more outdoor skills will be considered an asset. Familiarity with Lakehead University's Outdoor Recreation, Parks & Tourism program will be considered an asset.

Working Conditions

This position will involve working in office spaces at Lakehead University's main Thunder Bay campus as well as at the Outdoor Recreation Equipment Depot on Tungsten Street in Thunder Bay. Consulting with community organizations may involve local travel to their facilities in and around Thunder Bay. Piloting outdoor recreation programs will involve outdoor fieldwork in all four seasons in natural areas in the Thunder Bay region.
