Introduction

Welcome to GEOG 4811 Rural Geography. This class will provide you with an exploration of the many and varied cultural worlds of the rural landscape. If you have never done this type of course before, you may find the tempo challenging: this is a senior course and there is much reading and discussion expected. Please plan accordingly. This course is meant to prepare you to go out in the world with a solid knowledge of the physical, biological, and cultural geographies of rural life around the world.

Aim

By the end of this course, successful students should understand:

- 1) The varied vocabulary and concepts of rural geography
- 2) The many different rural cultures that have constructed modern North America
- 3) The dynamic of the physical environment on this continent and how it can impact how people live in different areas
- 4) The use of a variety of technologies to study how people live.

Successful students will also gain technical skills in:

- 1) Writing;
- 2) Research;
- 3) Cartography;

Successful students will emerge from this class with an absolutely unbearable need to travel and see rural areas. You should also develop a set of skills and a mind-set to allow you to conduct your expeditions, employment, and travels in an appropriate and culturally sensitive fashion.

There is no final examination in this course. We will meet weekly in seminar format and conduct 2 field trips to locations in rural Thunder Bay. You will be responsible for your transportation to the location of the field trips.
