#### **ASSIGNMENTS:**

In counterpoint to this, you will have two **written** assignments due on **two micro-region case studies** from across Canada. You will be presenting both of your case studies during class time, so plan accordingly. They are worth 25% of your term mark <u>each</u> (15% for the written portion and 10% for the presentation) so you'll want to put some good effort into these. Presentations will be scheduled throughout weeks 6-11 to coincide with when we cover the macro-regions. You will all be expected to ask and answer questions as well as take notes from each other's presentations and I will be including questions from them on your midterm test and final exam.
