Description

Completion of a thesis, based on individual original research, to be submitted by the date posted by the Department of Geography. Attendance at workshops is required. There will be an oral presentation at the end of the term.

Students in Geography 4011 and 4013 will be expected to bear the costs of any field research required.

Written assignments should be submitted in portable document format (.pdf) to both Dr. Cornwell AND the Thesis Supervisor no later than 5 pm on the due date.

A completed draft of the thesis is to be submitted by Friday, April 8. This will allow the advisor time to review and make suggestions for last-minute changes, and for the student to carry out the recommended changes before the final version is submitted to the department.

Thesis presentations will be scheduled for 1 pm April 8. Refer to the course manual for details on how oral presentations will be graded.

- all tables and figures have been completed and inserted in the thesis, along with the other required components (Abstract, Table of Contents; List of Figures; List of Tables; References);
- all grammatical, spelling and typing errors have been corrected.
