ASSIGNMENTS:

- The lectures will be based primarily on the textbook material which takes more of a 'zoomed out' approach, a regional geography of Canada.
- In counterpoint to this, you will have two assignments, one a **regional case studies** and one a **micro-region study** from any region in Canada.
- You'll be doing a final presentation and report on a micro-region (within your larger region) for 25% of your mark (15% written, 10% presentation). By March you should have enough material to do a presentation in class. Presentations will be scheduled during class time, throughout March. You will all be expected to ask and answer questions.

EXPECTATIONS:

- Regular attendance, of course. Readings are only supplemental to the course material covered in the bi-weekly lectures, so it's really important that you prioritize coming to all the lectures. They'll be so interesting you won't want to miss them anyway.
- Submission of assignments is expected by class time on the date that they are due.
- Late submissions of assignments (except in the case of medical or compassionate grounds arranged with me before the due date) will lose 10% per day.
- The midterm and the final exam must be written on dates scheduled. Make-up exams will only be arranged with a doctor's note and will have to be cleared with a Student Health Certificate: <http://registrar.lakeheadu.ca/uploads/docs/F.HealthCertificate.pdf>
