Description

A research project will be chosen after consultation with the department and with the agreement of the professor who will supervise the work. The central objective of this first part of the thesis class is to lay the groundwork for project completion in the Winter semester. During the Fall semester students will prepare a written thesis proposal, literature review, and research methods design. Two oral presentations will be made to the department.

Students in Geography 4011 and 4013 will be expected to bear the costs of any field research required.

Written assignments should be submitted in portable document format (.pdf) to both Dr. Cornwell AND the Thesis Supervisor no later than 5 pm on the due date.

Note that students must achieve a mark of at least 70% in Geography 4011 to be able to proceed to Geography 4013.

^{*}While no mark is assigned to the oral proposal, a five-percentage point penalty will be assessed for students who are absent that day without valid reason (compassionate or medical-related). A similar penalty will be applied when a student misses a workshop without being excused.

Course Delivery

This course, along with Geography 4013 in the Winter term, involves independent work that will be supervised by a Geography faculty member. During the fall semester, several mandatory workshops are offered during the regular scheduled time, either in class or via Zoom, to assist students in preparing necessary course components.
