John started with the Ministry of Northern Development and Mines (MNDM) in the 1970's where he progressed through the Resident Geologist program to become the Resident Geologist for the Beardmore-Geraldton area for a number of years. John rose through the ranks to become the Regional Manager for the northwest before retiring in the Fall of 2011 to work as Project Manager, Mining Services for the Thunder Bay Community Economic Development Commission (CEDC), to lead the development of a Mining Readiness Strategy.



#### Collaborations

The Department is currently collaborating with the Geological Survey of Canada and the Ontario Geological Survey as part of the Natural Resource Canada's Targeted Geoscience Iniative 4 program. The program is supporting the research of two MSc students. Ben Kuzmich (*Class of '12*) is working on Ti-V bearing granites in the Ring of Fire area, whereas Brent Trevisan is investigating the petrogenesis of the Midcontinent Rift-related Ni-Cu-PGE bearing Thunder Intrusion.
