Alan King will be offering a short course in **Geophysics for Geologists**.

Monday September 22, 2014, 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Tuesday September 23, 2014, 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

The course is a compressed version of a complete Applied Geophysics for Geologists course and is focused on, but not restricted to, mining exploration. The course is designed to teach the basics of geophysics based on most people's intuitive understanding of the physics of the world around them and give exploration geologists the tools and knowledge needed to demystify, understand, and apply geophysical methods. The course is built on people's intuitive understanding of everyday physical phenomena and is designed to give anybody a clear understanding of geophysics without a lot of equations. The course originated as a half year term, 40 hour course plus labs and has since been compressed with feedback and questions from various trainees to a 2 day course which has been used as an in house course at Inco and Vale as part of ongoing exploration training to various offices around the world. One of the gaps this course is designed to fill is the lack, in some earth science departments, of an applied geophysics course for exploration geologists as well as an update for those that studied geophysics as non-specialists in the past.

Alan received a B.Sc. in geology from the University of Toronto in 1976 and a M.Sc. in geophysics from Macquarie University in 1989.

From 1976 to 1984 he worked as a geophysicist in exploration and resource development in Canada and Australasia. In 1985 he joined GeoPhysiCon Co. Ltd. in Calgary Canada where he was involved in mining, geotechnical, oil sands and environmental applications for a variety of commodities. In 1990 he was employed by Inco Exploration and Technical Services Inc. as a senior geophysicist and in 1995 was promoted to Manager of Geophysics with responsibility for global exploration.

With the takeover of Inco by Vale in 2007 he moved to Brazil to assist with Vale's geophysical work in Brazil and moved back Canada in 2011. From 2009 to 2012 Alan was Chief Geophysicist for Vale Global Exploration working on geophysical applications for base metals, iron, manganese, coal and fertilizers (potash and phosphate) as well as target generation using regional and global data sets.

His professional interests include the use of geophysics and new technology (and ideas) in exploration, mining, environmental, geotechnical and other applications.
