

**Water, Land, and People: Support for Place-Responsive Research and Scholarship
2015-2018

Place-responsive research and scholarship promotes inquiry that is rooted in what is local—the unique history, environment, culture, economy, literature, and art of a particular place. Its central aim is to contribute to the well-being of places in the present and in the future, an aim which requires a deep understanding of a place's history. Place-responsive research and scholarship is in part a response against academic cultures that sometimes neglect the nearby places that universities ought to, but often do not, serve well. Place-responsive research and scholarship also aims to understand the linkages between one place and other places, and to demonstrate the interdependence between places in a global context.



The **Water, Land, and People** program will support research and scholarship by students and faculty that focuses on, and aims to contribute to, the geographic and cultural regions that Lakehead University serves throughout Ontario. Proposals are encouraged across all disciplines and departments. Collaborative proposals are also encouraged, as are multidisciplinary and transdisciplinary perspectives. Proposals must clearly state their relevance to the region, as well as articulate potential positive outcomes for the Ontario region's water, land, and/or people.

\$60,000 will be made available to students over three years (\$20,000 per year). Four \$5,000 individual awards will be available each year for three years. Student teams (two or more) may be awarded up to \$10,000 a year (the value of two awards). Proposals that demonstrate matching cash contributions from collaborating faculty members (their own research monies) will receive priority.

Research and scholarship supported by the Water, Land, and People program will be featured at an annual research symposium, and also on a website hosted by the Office of Research and Innovation. The intent is to encourage research and scholarship that substantively contributes to our communities, and to communicate the positive impacts of that work to a diversity of stakeholders.
