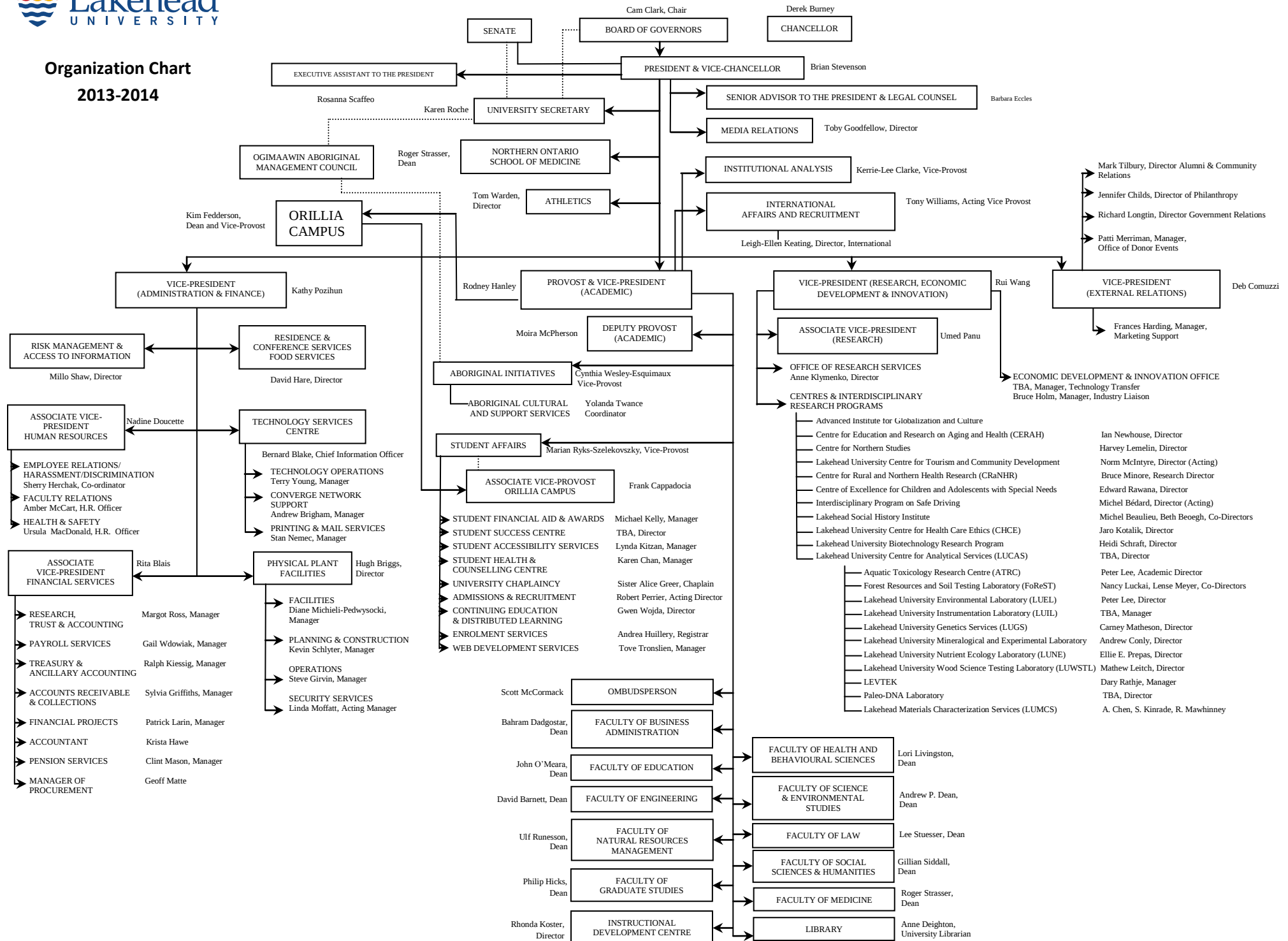

Lakehead University has dormitory, townhouse and apartment style residences.

Dormitories offer double, basic single and single rooms.

Townhouses have four single bedrooms each with the exception of two houses which have three bedrooms each.

Handicap accommodation is available in the townhouses.

Meal plans are required in dormitories and are available to townhouse and apartment residents.

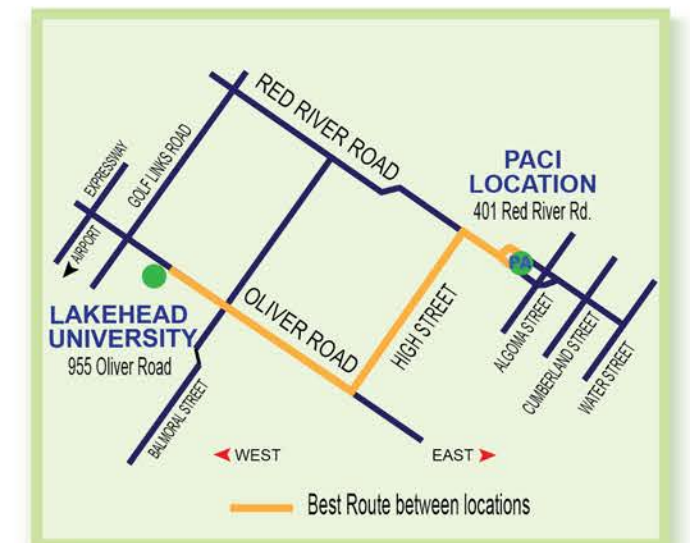

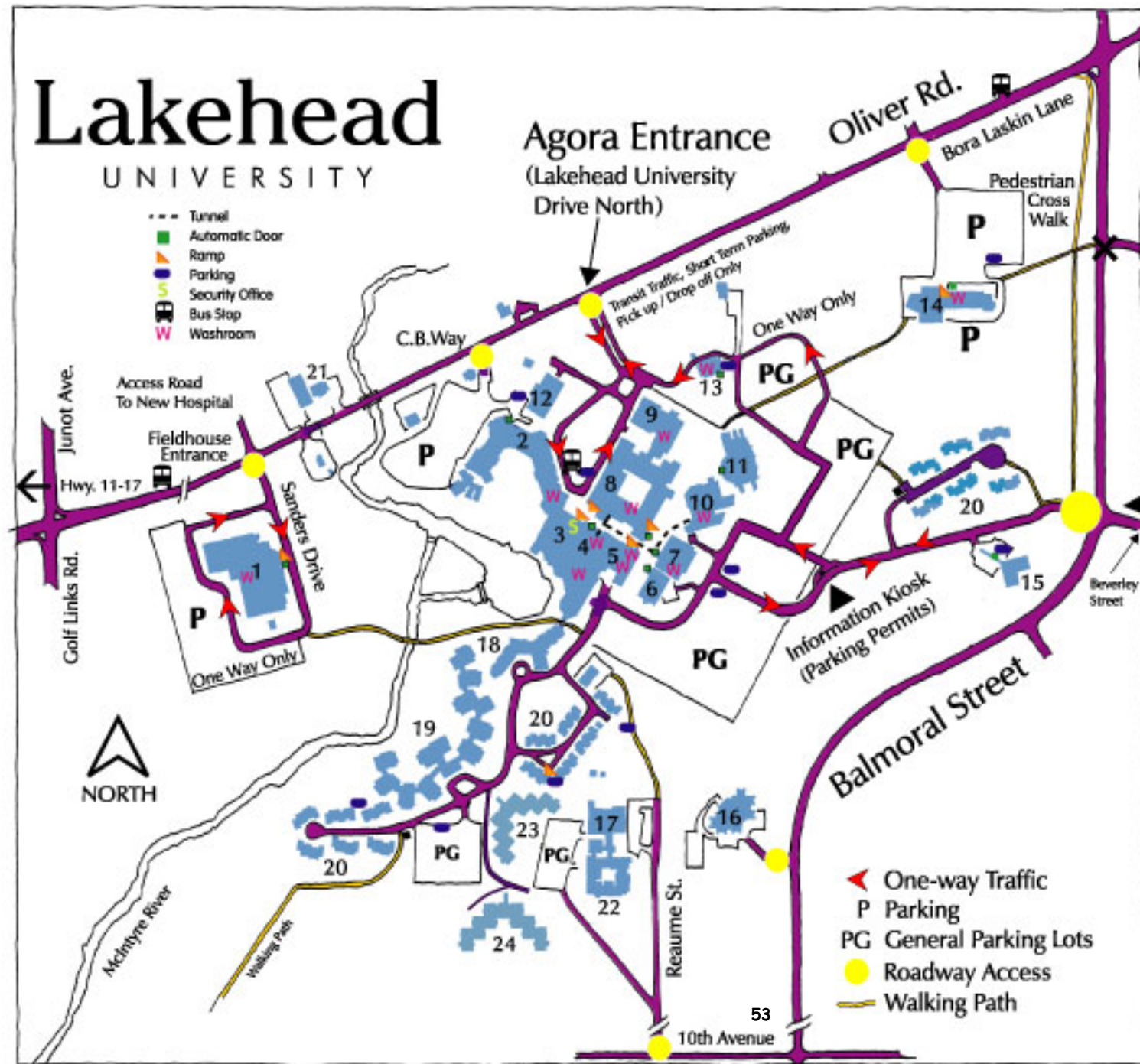
