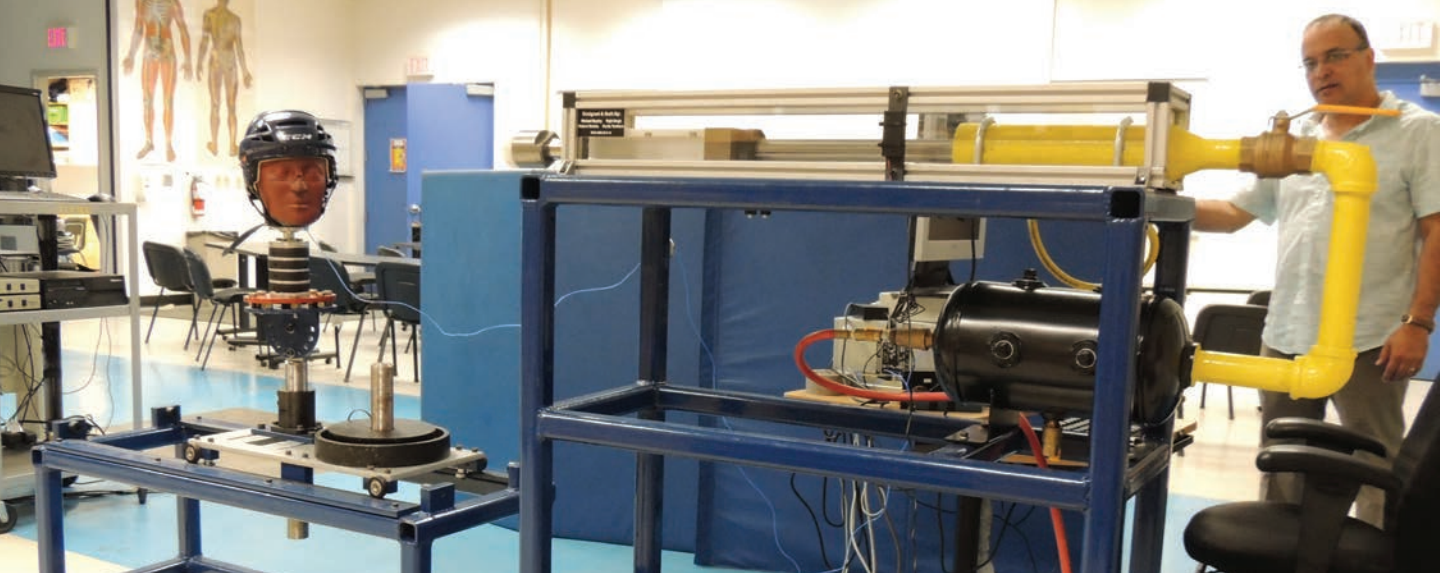

TWO-YEAR, THESIS-BASED PROGRAM

Lakehead is classified as a “smaller” institution. Our graduate programs are student-centred which allows us to foster close working relationships between the students, faculty, and staff. This collegial environment also affords our graduate students many opportunities to work, teach, and socialize.

In order to enhance your graduate school experience from a monetary perspective, we offer a large paid Graduate Assistantship program which provides students with the opportunity to gain valuable experience assisting professors with research projects and undergraduate course delivery. A variety of entrance scholarships, awards, and bursaries are also available to those who qualify.

Lastly, Lakehead University is located in Thunder Bay, Ontario: a picturesque and vibrant community with a scenic landscape primed for outdoor enthusiasts. Our students are encouraged to strike a work-play balance and can often be found enjoying any number of our nearby lakes and provincial parks, or partaking in activities such as hiking, skiing, or climbing.

FUNDING

All incoming MSc students receive an entrance scholarship up to \$1000 based on GPA. All first- and second-year MSc students receive a paid GA (Graduate Assistant) position either assisting with research or undergraduate course delivery. They pay approximately \$10,200 per year (2 semesters).

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Applicants for admission must be graduates of a recognized university, college, or institute as well as show evidence of scholarly achievement. Except where otherwise stated in the Admission Requirements of a particular program, degree students must have a four-year bachelor's degree or its equivalent with at least second class standing (B) based on their last 20 half courses or equivalent.

An applicant holding a degree other than one in the discipline area to which admission is sought will be considered on the basis of courses taken and academic standing. A Qualifying Year at the undergraduate level may be required to meet the admission standards. Courses taken as part of a Qualifying Year cannot be used as credit towards a graduate degree.

Meeting the minimum requirements does not necessarily guarantee admission. No candidate will be admitted unless the academic unit recommends admission. All applicants will be advised by the Office of Graduate Studies in writing of their admission status.

In addition to the general admission requirements for Master programs, the following requirements also apply:

- Applicants to the graduate program in Kinesiology who are required by the University admission regulations to write the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) must also write the Test of Written English (TWE) and achieve a minimum score of 3.5

REQUIRED APPLICATION DOCUMENTS

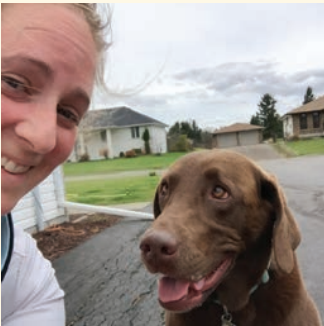
