DESCRIPTION

This introductory German language course is designed for students with <u>no previous knowledge</u> of German. Students will learn to listen to, speak, read and write German.

OBJECTIVES

GENERAL OBJECTIVES

The goal of this course is to familiarize students with the basics of the German language and culture.

Classes: To <u>learn</u> the building-blocks of the German.

Labs: To utilize the concepts & vocabulary.

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

We will be working with the course book Deutsch Aktuell 1, Seventh Edition, EMC Publishing: Wolfgang S. Kraft. We will also use the Workbook.

We may use supplementary materials to reinforce the subjects being learned and to diversify the course content. Any materials used in addition to the Deutsch Aktuell textbook and workbook shall be provided by the instructor digitally.

Due to the modifications made to this course to accommodate distanced-learning, students must download the Listening Activities Worksheets and Communicative Activities Worksheets from the D2L site. The instructor strongly suggests printing these documents for ease of use as they must be available for interactive reference during classes.

This course is designed to work through 4 Chapters in each semester: Kapitel 1- Kapitel 4 in Semester 1 and Kapitel 5- Kapitel 8 in Semester 2.

It is the obligation of all students to remain updated as to changes in the schedule.

METHODOLOGY

In conjunction with working through Chapters 1-8 of the Course book, students will be encouraged to maximize their written and spoken vocabularies. Labs will offer ample opportunities to put theory to practice.

Students will be expected to complete all assigned reading and exercises as well as participate in oral and listening comprehension activities.

Grammar matters, but communication is key!
