Do I meet the requirements to register in a French Major Program?

- **Grade 12 standing** is the normal requirement (Core French or French Immersion)
- If you have not completed your Grade 12 requirements, we offer **Elementary French – FREN 1000** (Grade 9 required) and **French for Beginners – FREN 0500**

I'm registered in a different discipline. Can I still take language courses?

- Yes! Finnish, French, German, Italian, Latin, Mandarin, and Spanish are offered at the introductory level.
