EXTRA TIME ACCOMMODATIONS FOR ONLINE TESTS/EXAMS/QUIZZES

STEP 1. CALCULATING EXTRA TIME FOR TESTS/EXAMS/QUIZZES

In many cases, the calculation of extra time for a student's test/exam/quiz will not require the use of a calculator. For example, if a student had the extra time accommodation of 30 additional minutes per hour, then the student's accommodated time for a 3-hour exam would be:

 $3 \text{ hrs.} + (3 \times 30 \text{ min.} \text{ for each hour}) = 3 \text{ hrs.} + 90 \text{ min.} = 4 \text{ hrs.} + 30 \text{ min.}$

For more complicated calculations, the following formula can be used: SAT = CD x (1 + ET/60) where: SAT is the Student's Accommodated Time (to be calculated in minutes initially) CD is the Classroom Duration (in minutes) ET/60 is the student's extra time noted in additional minutes per hour

STEP 2. ADJUSTING THE STUDENT'S EXTRA TIME

Ensure that you add the extra time accordingly prior to each online test/exam/quiz for all students with accommodations in your courses. If you are using the D2L platform and are experiencing any technical issues with these adjustments, please email the Teaching Commons.
