WHO DO WE HELP

Students can be registered with SAS for a wide variety of disabilities/medical conditions including:

Accommodations are provided on an individual basis, supported by each student's documented functional limitations.



HOW DO WE HELP

SAS facilitates the provision of academic accommodations for students with disabilities and/or medical conditions. These accommodations can vary but some examples of accommodations for lectures may include note takers, recording of lectures, and text in alternate format. Exam and test accommodations may include extra time, alternate setting, and the use of assistive technology.
