Grading Scheme: There will be two term tests worth $10 \%$ each. The homework for the first term will count for $10 \%$, as will the homework for the second term. The Christmas exam will be worth $30 \%$, and the final exam will also be worth $30 \%$.

Homework: Each week the problems from the preceding week in the homework column of the schedule are to be handed in. There will be a mailbox for these on the second floor of RB. They are due on Fridays at 5pm (so, for example, the questions on sections 1.1-1.4 are to be handed in by 5 pm on Friday Sept 24 ). The problems for 8.5-8.7 are due by 5 pm Friday March 4. Shortly after this time the mailbox will be emptied, and
it will not be examined again until the next week. Late assignments will not be accepted. Solutions to the problems will be distributed by email.

Term Tests and Final Exam: The two term tests will be held during class time in the class room (the dates are on the schedule). They will be closed book with no calculators or other aids allowed. The material the tests will cover will be announced in class as the dates draw near. The Christmas and final exams will also be closed book with no calculators or other aids allowed. The Christmas exam will cover the whole first term, and the final exam will cover the whole course.
