The mid-term examination is a take home exam consisting of short answer and essay type questions that you will return by email within 72 hours (sent to students on October 26, 2021 at 9:00 a.m.; to be returned by students on October 29, 2021 at 9:00 a,m.). The final examination (one and one half hours in length) is a closed book examination and will be scheduled during the December exam period. The student presentation/essay submission is optional, with presentations scheduled for November classes: only students who do not choose to do the student presentation/essay option will be required to write the final examination in the December examination period from December 9 to December 19. Student presentations will occur in-class for 30-45 minutes each, with the essay covering the topic presented in class. Power point presentations to be submitted to lecturer and to all students 48 hours prior to presentation.

The final examination will include questions from the entire term and will be based on all lectures, all power point slides, all student presentations and all assigned readings.
