Evaluation:

The evaluation scheme will consist of the following items:

- A research proposal worth 10% of the total course grade, due on <u>23 January</u>, and presenting the topic of the research paper that is due at the end of the semester.
- A bibliography of the material that will be used for the research paper that is due at the end of the semester. This bibliography is worth 10% of the total course grade and is due on the <u>30 January</u>.
- An analytical summary of the main 6 sources/material that will be used in your final research paper, analysed in terms of their relevance to your research topic. This analytical summary is worth 20% of the total course grade and is due on the <u>13 February</u>.
- A written progress report worth 10% of the total course grade and is due on the <u>27</u> February
- An oral presentation of research results, in front of the entire class, worth 10% of the total course grade, and to be done on 20 March, 27 March or 3 April.
