Course Objective:

This course is designed to provide students with a general knowledge of the sociological characteristics and social issues of the Circumpolar North. It starts with a general introduction to the region and by trying to answer the question “What is the Circumpolar North?”. Students are then introduced to the general environmental and social characteristics of the region and more specifically to the two main types of communities in the region: Aboriginal communities and resource-dependent communities. Emphasis is given to the types of changes that are currently affecting the region.

The second part of the course will examine the major social challenges facing Northern communities. These challenges include education, health, environmental, political, and gender-related issues.

Learning Outcomes:

Upon completion of this course, students should be able to:

1. Explain the specific sociological characteristics and social issues associated with the Circumpolar North.
2. Describe the various definitions of the Circumpolar North.
3. List and describe the main types of communities in the Circumpolar North and the recent changes that these communities are experiencing.
4. Describe the Circumpolar North’s main economic activities as well as explain how changes in these activities have impacted aboriginal and resource-dependent communities.
5. Communicate the major social challenges that Northern communities face including education, health, environmental, political, and gender-related issues.
6. Collect and evaluate secondary-sources in order to address issues and questions related to the Circumpolar North.

Texts:

There will be no required texts. Students will be required to read articles placed in the reserve or to be downloaded off the internet. Many of the articles used in the course are chapters in the [Arctic Human Development Report](#) which can be accessed at the sites

indicated in the reading list. Please download them and print them out if you prefer reading printed material.

Learning journals: Participants will be asked to submit a learning journal on October 20, 2014. The learning journal should contain reflective comments on material dealt with in 7 separate classes and should contain a research question and bibliography for their research paper. Each reflective comment should be a coherent statement on something you learned in the lecture, the reading, film, or other component of the course. It should be a critical reflection on something you learned through these components. For a description of the learning journal marking scheme please see the Learning Journal Rubric posted on the course website.

Research Paper: Participants will be required to write a 12-15 page (3000 word) research paper on a contemporary northern social issue. Topics should be chosen in consultation with the professor. Participants will submit a research question and bibliography as part of their learning journal. The completed paper is due on Dec. 1, 2014. Research papers should use the manuscript format suggested by the American Sociological Association.
